FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

MONDAY, 2nd JUNE

St. Marcellinus & St. Peter: Martyrs. When Serenus heard that Marcellinus and Peter were successfully converting people to Christianity, he called them before him. Serenus sharply rebuked Marcellinus and Peter; adding to his bitter words, threats and terrors, unless they would deny Christ. However, both of them were unshaken in their testimony.

TUESDAY, 3rd JUNE

St. Charles Lwanga and Companions: King Mwangi was a violent ruler in Uganda and he had killed both Catholics and protestants for refusing to give up their faith. Around 1885 Charles Lwanga and his companions (some of the earliest converts) took over the instruction and leadership of the Christian community. Their faith, intelligence, courage and wisdom kept the Catholic Church alive and growing in Uganda.

THURSDAY, 5th JUNE

St. Boniface: (Winfrid/Wynfrith). Apostle of Germany. Date of birth unknown; martyred 5th June, 755 (754). He made his profession as a member of the Benedictine Order and was placed in charge of the monastic school. At the age of thirty he was ordained priest. St. Boniface excelled especially in the profound understanding of scriptures. Tailors, brewers and file-cutters have chosen St. Boniface as their patron as have various cities in Germany.

FRIDAY, 6th JUNE

St. Norbert: Born at Kanten, near Wesel c. 1080; died at Magdeburg, 6th June 1134. Norbert was 35 when he received Holy Orders. As a result of his preaching, the people of the Low Countries abjured their heresies and brought back to him the Sacred Species, which they had stolen. In commemoration of this, St. Norbert has been proclaimed the Apostle of Antwerp. He was canonized by Gregory XIII in 1582.
